## MAYA FOSTER-MILLS - APPRENTICESHIP WITH LOUIS GODBER



I'm a level 2 apprentice with Elle McCoan and Louis Godber. We are a professional show jumping / breaking yard, based in Nottinghamshire. We currently have 13 horses in, ranging from young horses that are ready to start their show jumping career to competition horses. Our main aim is to produce young horses from the very start of their education up through the age classes. We have top class facilities, including a 50x100m outdoor school, along with an indoor school, all weather canter track with a jump field in the centre, walker, horse treadmill, wash bays and solarium. We offer breaking, schooling and competition livery.



I started my apprenticeship with the aim of learning how to work with young horses (understanding the process of breaking and producing), improving my riding and show jumping career, improving my knowledge of horse care, gaining experience at shows, and understanding how a professional yard works. These aims have definitely been achieved thanks to SCT for their innovative and dynamic online learning programme which is helping my education and training. I am also indebted to my employers Louis and Elle for giving me their professional guidance, huge opportunities to ride at top class shows, training when riding/jumping, and dealing with young horses. They are so generous with their time, which I'm certainly grateful for. I'm excited to continue to learn and improve further, and hopefully continue to excel at shows, as that's my biggest passion. My jobs consist of all general yard duties including, keeping the yard clean and tidy, washing out the wash box, sweeping the feed room, cleaning tack and keeping the tack room organised, sweeping the walker, mucking out, sweeping the yard, cleaning water drinkers and feed buckets. I also care for the horses after exercise, bath and plait the horses ready for competition, lunge, put horses on the walker and treadmill, and ride. I have been learning to help with the young horses and the start of their ridden career.

I am loving being able to see how a professional yard runs, the process of producing horses, and improving my time management when at shows. My riding has improved massively over my time with Elle and Louis. I am now competitive, jumping Foxhunters at shows, and am hoping to continue to go up the ranks, with the hope of one day turning professional. I also enjoy riding the young horses as it's very rewarding and being able to ride a wide range of horses is also improving my riding as it helps with adapting to different horses. I am excited to further my knowledge and experience by continuing to Level 3 with SCT. I'm also grateful to have my SCT coach Natalie Reynolds who's always on hand for coaching, help, and advice along the way'.

## VISIT TO THE KING'S TROOP



As part of our aim to promote career opportunities following the Advanced Apprenticeship we organised a visit to The King's Troop Royal Horse Artillery in London on Thursday 16 June 2022. The day was designed to give an insight into the ceremonial aspects of the British Army and to help develop an understanding of the qualities required of a Mounted Gunner.



Each year the The King's Troop recruits people, 18 years and over, as farriers, saddlers, tailors, riding instructors and soldiers. All successful applicants become soldiers, completing Basic Training, followed by 14 weeks artillery training, and are then based at Woolwich as a Mounted Gunner. The King's Troop is currently actively recruiting and seeks mature, responsible and reliable people with a high level of initiative and attention to detail. Applicants that have completed their Apprenticeship and worked full time employed with horses will have a significant advantage in recruitment.



The visit included the chance to watch the Draught Parade, talks and tours of the Gun Park, Stables, Saddlers, Farriers and Tailors. It was a superb opportunity and we hugely appreciated the hospitality of the King's Troop for inviting us to have this privileged insight into their role and functions.
