It is a huge privilege for us to have worked with Spencer as an apprentice with Andrew Saywell, and now as an employer of apprentices. LUCY TAYLOR - APPRENTICESHIP WITH SCT









I first sat on a horse as a toddler and have always been part of an equestrian family. I helped at weekends and through the school holidays at Parkside Stables. After losing my second horse, a Welsh Section B pony called Trooper, we bought Ben. He is a Welsh Section C gelding. He is now 21 and I have had him for 6 years. Ben and I have regular lessons with Jane Portas, to improve our jumping skills. For the last two seasons, we have taken part in various activities, including: county level showing, in-hand classes, working hunter and the Barlow Hunter Trials. We recently competed at Arena UK at the British Elite Championship Show for Horses. We came 2nd in the Mountain & Moorland Working Hunter, but sadly didn't make it into the championships in the evening performance. In July, I started my Level 2 Apprenticeship with Stubbing Court Training and I have used the Online Learning programme to help me to understand what to expect when looking after and taking horses to competitions. This is a great way of showing/telling you how to do the right things around your own horse as well as when you're at work. I have also been able to groom at BS competitions for my employer, Belinda Turner, with her horse Wodka Lime. I am excited to be learning new skills from my apprenticeship with SCT. Working on a yard full time has helped my time keeping, how a yard is run as a tidy yard and have learnt how to prepare a horse for competitions. I feel that I am continuously developing my knowledge and skills to help me with my work, riding my own horse and my future career working with horses. I have been privileged to be able to travel to Rossdales Equine Hospital in Newmarket. Wodka has a very rare kidney stone problem. But so far it has been a success, the worldrenowned vets removed the kidney stone out of Wodka's bladder. Belinda and I even got to take the stone home. Rossdales is very different to your local vets, it is really clean and a very big place, they have stabling for day visits to diagnose unknown lameness, amazing technology, also turnout and exercise arenas. On our first visit to Rossdales with Wodka I watched the screen where they were scoping his bladder while I was holding his head. He also had an ultrasound scan, so I was able to see the stones in his kidney. In September, Ben and I stayed away at our first show, taking part at the Veteran Horse Society National Veteran Championships at Bury



Farm EC. This included three full days of ridden, in-hand and working hunter classes. We qualified for this in May, at Nottinghamshire County Show. We won both in hand and ridden, taking Champion in the in hand and Reserve Champion in the ridden! On the Saturday we were just as busy in the ridden M&M and two working hunter classes, going clear and winning all three. Later that day was the evening performance where the championships took place, we got Reserve Champion in the ridden and working hunter M&M. Our last day Sunday, we were entered in the in hand M&M. Ben being a star winning and taking Champion in the M&M section. Such a fun, friendly and emotional few days away with my family and pony, Ryanwyn Theoden.
